In states where CPN has a presence, over **893 thousand** individuals live with mobility, cognitive, self-care, or independent living challenges. These numbers fuel our mission — empowering us to deliver programs that not only respond to urgent needs but also drive lasting change for the paralysis community.

Dear Friends

In January of 2000, my life changed forever.

While preparing for the upcoming racing season at the Walt Disney World Speedway, I suffered a devastating crash during a test run. In a split second, I went from being a professional IndyCar driver to a quadriplegic—paralyzed from the shoulders down. The physical, emotional, and mental hurdles that followed were immense, but from the very beginning, I refused to accept that my life—and the lives of others like me—couldn't still be full of purpose, hope, and progress.

The accident ended my racing career, but it also launched a new mission: to redefine what's possible for people living with spinal cord injuries and other neurological conditions.

That mission began with the creation of the Sam Schmidt Paralysis Foundation, which evolved into what is now known as Conquer Paralysis Now (CPN). Over the years, we've grown from a personal crusade into a nationally recognized organization focused on improving quality of life for individuals living with paralysis—not someday, but today.

CPN has invested millions into improving the quality of life for those that are part of the paralysis community. Along the way, we discovered that real change also means providing immediate, hands-on care to help people live independently, regain function, and rebuild their lives. That realization led to the opening of our first DRIVEN NeuroRecovery Center in Las Vegas.

This cutting-edge facility offers activity-based therapy, mental health services, adaptive fitness, and community support under one roof. Over the past year we have expanded our impact with the opening of our new DRIVEN NeuroRecovery Center in Indianapolis. We partnered with an exemplary existing rehabilitation center, NeuroHope, to provide the resources offered at our new center.

Conquer Paralysis Now is more than just a foundation. It's a movement. It's a promise to those living with paralysis that they are not forgotten, and that they deserve access to the tools and resources that will help them thrive.





Our Las Vegas center served 6% more clients, while our Indianapolis location—operated by our partner NeuroHope—saw a remarkable 17% increase in the number of individuals served. Thanks to CPN's continued investment, the Indianapolis center was also able to nearly triple the square footage that NeuroHope previously operated, thus helping them to achieve such amazing results.



Focused on the Future, Rooted in Purpose

In 2024, Conquer Paralysis Now (CPN) took a bold step forward by relocating our headquarters to Indianapolis, Indiana. This pivotal move culminated in the opening of the new DRIVEN NeuroRecovery Center—a 114,000-square-foot, state-of-the-art facility dedicated to transforming the lives of individuals living with paralysis and other neurological conditions.

With your support, DRIVEN Indy is now home to an advanced **Aquatic Center** featuring two HydroWorx therapy pools, as well as two inclusive **Sports Courts** designed to promote physical activity, wellness, and community for those we serve. These resources are more than just facilities—they are lifelines for people striving to regain independence, strength, and hope.

We are proud of our accomplishments, but our work is just beginning!

In 2025, we will develop one of the Sports Courts to support **adaptive sports programs** across Indiana. We look forward to being able to providing space for competitive and recreational adaptive sports teams. Accessible, consistent training space is incredibly difficult to secure—especially when able-bodied athletics are often given booking priority. This initiative ensures that athletes with disabilities have a dedicated, reliable space to thrive.

We're also addressing the critical barrier of transportation. As highlighted in the CDC's Disability Inclusion Report (2025), lack of reliable transit is one of the biggest challenges people with paralysis face in accessing care. To help overcome this, CPN will be creating an **in-house community collaboration ecosystem** on the building's second floor. Spanning approximately 27,000 square feet, this space will bring together for-profit and nonprofit partners to provide wrap-around services under one roof - providing services in one location and reducing the amount of travel our clients need to navigate to get the services they need.

These initiatives reflect our unwavering dedication to **innovation**, **collaboration**, and **community engagement**. Because of your continued support, CPN is building more than a facility—we're building a future where individuals living with paralysis have direct access to the care, resources, and opportunities they need to thrive.
